### **QATAR BEGINS COVID-19 VACCINATION CAMPAIGN**



Qatar has launched a free coronavirus vaccination campaign on December 23<sup>rd</sup> after the first batch of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine arrived in the country.

The vaccine will be administered in two doses, three weeks apart at seven primary health centres in the country. The first vaccine was successfully given to 79-year-old Abdullah Al Kubaisi, former Qatar University president.

The first vaccination phase, dedicated to high-risk groups, will run until January 31, 2021 Qatar Government expects to have enough vaccines to cover the entire population in 2021.

Qatar vaccine plan so far includes the following vaccines:

- Pfizer-BioNTech
- Moderna
- Oxford-AstraZeneca

Amid the global pandemic, Qatar has been able to restrict its number of cases and deaths by extensive testing, with more than 1.2 million people tested since the start of the pandemic, almost half of its population.


#### The Emir of Qatar Receives Covid-19 Vaccine

HH the Amir, Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani received the COVID-19 vaccine on Wednesday, December 30, 2020.

H.H. the Amir's Instagram account informed of the news quoting HH saying:

"Today I took the Covid~19 vaccine, and I wish everyone safety and protection from this pandemic."





The risk of developing severe complications due to COVID-19 increases with age. People over 70 years of age have a higher risk of severe illness and death.

People with certain long-term chronic medical conditions, including diabetes, asthma, and heart disease, or compromised immune systems, have an increased risk of developing severe complications due to COVID-19, regardless of their age.

Healthcare workers, especially doctors, nurses and paramedics working directly with COVID-19 patients, have an increased risk of being exposed to COVID-19 and catching the virus and becoming sick.

## Low GHG and Energy Consumption Efforts by Qatar Foundation

- Fin QF's research sector, Qatar Environment and Energy Research Institute (QEERI) studies on Qatar's energy and water security challenges and tackles climate change at national and regional levels from the scientific perspective. QEERI enhances research capacity on local climate tailored renewable energy system development and energy storage technologies.
- As a member organization of QF, Qatar Green Building Council (QGBC) endeavors creating a green building and sustainability culture within the industry and the community, through education and communication and providing the industry professionals with expert training on sustainability and green building practices.
- From 2019, QF has been tracking efforts on carbon monitoring and emissions reduction by launching the Carbon Change Action Initiative. In January 2020, QF organized a climate change public conference to encourage and push Qatari companies and organizations to introduce initiatives and put in efforts to tackle climate change.

QATAR'S FOOD SECURITY STRATEGY 2019 – 2023 STANDS ON FOUR PILLARS

Qatar laid the foundations of its National Food Security Strategy 2019-2023 to optimise the use of the country's natural and water resources, fortify the food security system against shocks during emergencies, identify priorities in terms of food security initiatives and projects, protect and promote local production, improve food quality and safety and maintain a safe and healthy strategic stock.

Just in two years, Qatar was able to achieve high levels of self-sufficiency in terms of various agricultural products and secure a strategic stock of commodities.

And now, Qatar is expected to be among top ten countries in Global Food Security Index by 2021, it currently ranks I<sup>st</sup> in the middle East and I3<sup>th</sup> Globally



- \*106% self-sufficiency in dairy products increased from 27%
- \*127% self-sufficiency in fresh poultry from 49%
- \*75% self-sufficiency in fish production targeting 95 percent by 2023

# Doha ready to host FIFA Club World Cup Qatar 2020, to take place between 4-11 February 2021

Qatar is set to host the FIFA Club World Cup Qatar 2020 this coming February, the organizing committee affirmed full readiness to host the matches of the I7th edition of the Championship, which will be held at Ahmed Bin Ali and Education City stadiums from February 4-II, with the participation of six clubs.

The Club World Cup will be staged with strict measures to combat the spread of Covid-I9, the Qatari organisers said less than two weeks before the tournament which will be closed to overseas fans.

It is due to get underway on February 4 with spectator numbers capped at 30 % of capacity at each of the two 40,000-seat grounds which will host games. The organizing committee, in cooperation with the Ministry of Health, will implement a comprehensive health protocol during the tournament, pointing out that there are precautionary measures applied in the process of selling and buying tickets and the attendance of the fans in the stadium.

Six clubs will compete at the FIFA Club World Cup Qatar 2020, including Al Duhail SC, FC Bayern Munchen, Egyptian Al Ahly SC, Tigres UANL and Ulsan Hyundai FC.

# DOHA WILL BE THE HOST OF THE 21<sup>ST</sup> ASIAN GAMES 2030



Doha is set to host the 21st edition of the Asian Games in 2030, the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) has announced last December 2020.

At the announcement ceremony in Muscat, the Doha 2030 Bid Committee was represented by QOC Chairman H E Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani and top athletes like Mutaz Barshim and Nada Arakji.

Asian Games 2030 will be the second time Qatar's capital has hosted the games, with the first time taking place in 2006.

According to the OCA, Doha "put forward a compact and risk-free bid, with all sports stadiums already in place".

It added, "The award of the Asian Games will further boost its profile as a world-class sports city, capable of hosting major international events in a variety of sports."
