QATAR ALLOWS 100% OWNERSHIP FOR FOREIGN INVESTORS



In early 2019, Qatar Amir H H Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani issued a new law that allows foreign investors to own 100% ownership in all sectors, as well as support for investors' entry into the Qatari market.

The law offers many investment incentives including:

- *allocation of land to non-Qatari investors to establish investment
- The non-Qatari investors can import what he/she needs for the investment
- Exempting the project from income tax in accordance with Income Tax Law.
- Non-Qatari investment projects shall be exempted from customs duties on their imports of machinery and necessary equipment they import for their establishments.
- In the field of industry, raw materials and semi-manufactured items for production which are not available in the local markets will be exempted from custom duties on their imports.

Qatari Government Allows Foreigners to Own Properties within 16 Areas

In October 2020, The Qatari Government has announced that Non-Qatari individuals could own properties in nine areas, up from three before, while the number of areas where foreigners may use real estate has also been increased to 16.

Foreign companies can also own properties in nine areas, a big boost from the past when they were only allowed access to real estate ownership within the confines of The Pearl Island project in Doha.

TACKLING COVID-19: BARZAN HOLDINGS PRODUCES 8,000 VENTILATORS PER MONTH

Amid the Covid-19 pandemic, the Ministry of Defence-affiliated company Barzan Holdings has managed to manufacture ventilators that are 100% locally made in record time.

The company is currently producing up to 8,000 ventilators per month to meet the needs of the local and global market.

Barzan is making their Savr-Q ventilators at their headquarters in the Qatar Science and Technology Park from April as Coronavirus pandemic spread around the world.



Qatar Ranks 1st Worldwide on Digital Accessibility Rights Evaluation Index 2020

Qatar has ranked first worldwide on the Digital Accessibility Rights Evaluation Index 2020 (DARE Index 2020) released by the Global Initiative for Inclusive Information and Communication Technologies (G3ict).

DARE Index is a benchmarking tool for disability advocates, governments, civil society, international organizations and policymakers to trace country progress in making Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) accessible for all.

DARE Index 2020 data demonstrates Qatar's belief in the importance of investing in ICTs to unleash the potential of the disabled and help them enjoy independence and self-reliance. Qatar came number-one on the global ranking, the regional ranking, the Peer Economic Development Group Ranking and the Implementation Ranking.





Hamad Port — Qatar's gateway to the world- is currently a major bottleneck to the development of the country under Qatar National Vision 2030, and capable of handling up to 7.8 million tonnes of products annually.



DOHA WILL BE THE HOST OF ALL AFC CHAMPIONS LEAGUE EAST GAMES AS WELL AS THE FINAL

The AFC Champions League (East) is to be played in Doha, Qatar, after an agreement was reached between the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) and the Qatar Football Association (QFA).

The AFC Champions League (East), which will be played between November 18 and December 13, 2020, follows the successful completion of the West Zone competition in Qatar.

The Asian Football Confederation (AFC), together with the Qatar Football Association (QFA), have also announced Doha as the venue for this year's AFC Champions League single-leg final, which will be held on December 19.

AFC general secretary Dato Windsor John said: "The Covid-19 pandemic has undoubtedly made the decision on the venue for this year's final more complex particularly in these uncertain times of travel and health restrictions.

"The safety and wellbeing of all participating clubs as well as the protection of all stakeholders has been crucial to the AFC. So, we must thank the Qatar Football Association and the Qatar local authorities and ministries for putting in place the necessary health measures and effective medical protocols."

Microsoft Azure datacenter in Qatar going online in 2021



A new cloud datacenter region in Qatar is currently being under development in co-operation between the Ministry of Transport and Communications and Microsoft. The initiative seeks to deliver Microsoft's intelligent, trusted cloud services and expand the Microsoft global cloud infrastructure to 55 cloud regions in 20 countries.

The new region is anticipated to be available starting with Microsoft Azure in 2021, and Office 365, Dynamics 365 and Power Platform to follow.

The new region will be managed from the Qatari Free Zones to show their capabilities at the global level as a modern and distinctive incubator for such initiatives, in order to enhance self-sufficiency and sustainability and improve the local environment and make it effective in developing the region and the world.
