

Arts in Qatar

Art is serious business in Qatar.

Qatar is officially the world's biggest art buyer. Over the last six years Qatar has been buying art at a level never seen before and is responsible for the bulk of all modern art purchases worldwide.

This is in line with the aim to make Qatar the cultural capital of the Middle East, and a hub for regional cultural tourism.



The rapid growth of this cultural portfolio is set on course for the influx of the world to Qatari shores with the 2022 FIFA World Cup and is already evident on arrival at Hamad International Airport (HIA), with the passenger terminals showcasing a varied selection of local and international art, curated by Qatar Museums Authority. As well as Qatar Museums Authority's showcase museums, Qatar is host to a burgeoning arts culture, with Doha Film Institute developing and promoting regional and international film makers, Qatar Philharmonic Orchestra bringing symphonic music to the region, galleries both privately owned or under government sponsorship, classes and workshops available from fashion and fine arts to dance and drumming.

Archaeology and Heritage


The Archaeology and architectural conservation departments manage, conserve, and protect archaeology and archaeological practices in Qatar.

Qatar Museum of Islamic Art

The Museum of Islamic Art (MIA) houses one of the most comprehensive collections of Islamic art in the world, with masterpieces from every corner of the globe representing the diversity found in Islamic heritage.

Designed by world-renowned architect I.M. Pei, the MIA building has become an icon of the Doha skyline.

Sitting across the water from the spectacular skyline of West Bay, it draws influence from traditional Islamic architecture. The building is made from limestone, which captures hourly changes in light and shade.

The geometric patterns of the Islamic world adorn the inside space, making for a grand interior. A variety of textures and materials, including wood and stone, have created a unique environment for the museum's stunning collections. With incredible views across the bay, it's a central part of Doha's burgeoning cultural scene.



National Museum of Qatar (NMOQ)





The National Museum of Qatar (NMoQ) is dedicated to bringing to life the story of Qatar and its people. It actively gives voice to the nation's rich heritage and culture and demonstrates Qatar's extensive network of ties with other nations and people around the world. Designed to be vibrant and immersive, the museum is a space where diverse communities can come together and experience Qatar's past, present and future.

NMoQ's iconic building, which was designed by French architect Jean Nouvel, made a dramatic addition to the Doha landscape when it opened in 2019.

In addition to the unique architecture and stunning gallery spaces, the museum features a 220-seat auditorium, two restaurants, a café, and a traditional food forum.

For scholars and students, the museum offers a new research centre and laboratories along with access to digital archives. The Park at NMoQ also provides visitors with a chance to explore and learn about Qatar's indigenous plants and their role in Qatari culture.



MATHAF

Arab Museum of Modern Art

Mathaf is a boundary-breaking museum that invites visitors to celebrate the creativity of the contemporary Arab world. Its spaces are designed to be used, not just visited. Beyond its galleries, Mathaf brings people together to learn, share ideas and enter debate. From groundbreaking exhibitions to engaging conversations with artists to a creative internship programme, Mathaf creates opportunities for everyone to deepen their relationship with art of our time.

Galleries and Art Spaces in Qatar

Al Riwaq Art Space is a non-profit space supporting contemporary art practice established in 1998, to promote creativity and art value providing exhibition space to emerging and established artists, both local and international.

Based in MIA grounds this huge gallery space hosts regular exhibitions of both regional and international artists such as Damien Hirst and Takashi Murakami, under the premise of 'art to spark debate'.





Al Markhiya Gallery represents a collection of talented emerging and established contemporary Arab artists from Qatar, the wider Arab region and throughout the world.

The gallery seeks out partnerships and collaborative opportunities with other major galleries globally.

Their professional network provides for the exchanges of exhibitions and increases exposure for local and regional talent.

Fire Station: Artists in Residence

Artist in Residence is an annual ninemonth residency program, from September to June, where artists are given studio space in one of the five floors of the Fire Station building. The residency is an opportunity for artists residing in Qatar to develop their art practice through the program, which includes mentorship, working with curators, open studios and access to the building's facilities (fabrication lab, woodshop and exhibition spaces).

The new Fire Station building provides 24 studios and a gallery space for exhibition and community interaction;

Qatar Philharmonic Orchestra (QPO)

Established to bring symphonic music to the region, but, also be a platform for music from all over the world. Qatar Philharmonic Orchestra celebrates both western and Arabic music. Part of the orchestra's mandate is to host new and established composer's, conductor's and soloists from the Arab world.

QPO has at least forty programmes a year both at its home in Katara Opera House and abroad on tour.

Founded in 2007, the Qatar Philharmonic Orchestra was a personal initiative of H.H. Sheikha Moza bint Nasser. In its first years, it was greatly supported by Maestro Lorin Maazel who helped highten international awareness during a large number of tours to Europa and the US. Artistic partnerships with Gerd Albrecht, Marc Minkowski, Dmitri Kitayenko or first-class singers like Roberto Alagna and Angela Gheorghiu further contributed to its artistic development.



Doha Film Institute



Based in Katara Cultural Village, Doha Film Institute seeks to create a culture of film appreciation within Qatar and the region by creating an all-encompassing film hub. Their motto 'Film is Life' is about using film as part of the culture, community as well as for education and entertainment.

DFI aims to nurture and develop local and regional storytellers, but within a global context and scope. DFI hosts several festivals and has regular screenings.

Doha Film Institute is Qatar's first international organisation dedicated to film financing, production, education and the Film Festivals, established in 2010 by Sheikha Al-Mayassa bint Hamad bin Khalifa Al-Thani to support the growth of the local film community.

Katara Cultural Village is the largest multidimensional cultural project in Qatar, aspiring to create diverse interaction through art and cultural exchange. It houses:

Katara Art Centre

Founded in 2011 by Tariq Al Jaidah in the iconic and unique Katara Village (Building 5 - Next to the Amphitheater), the KAC is a cultural hub that has been developed to provide a creative ecosystem that goes beyond the typical standards of art, design and culture. It has its own spirit, identity and creative heart.

The KAC is also an art incubator that strengthens the cultural branding of Qatar by helping artists to grow and hosting art events and concepts, shaping Katara Village as one of the leading spots of design, art and culture within the Middle East. They developed many events with world class brands such as Sotheby's.
